## 1889 FOUNDATION-JEFFERSON CENTER FOR POPULATION HEALTH TO BE ESTABLISHED

The mission of the 1889 Foundation is to support innovative programs that transform the overall health and wellness of our community — and our biggest initiative to date is the 1889 Foundation-Jefferson Center for Population Health. A \$7.5 million, five-year gift from the foundation is making it possible.

Announced in February, the center is a partnership between the foundation and the Jefferson College of Population Health of Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia. The center, which will be based in Johnstown, will identify, quantify and develop strategies

for improving the health of citizens in Cambria and Somerset Counties.

"Population health is a relatively new concept — it takes a systemic approach to healthcare that is about preventing disease by addressing social and environmental factors outside the care delivery system that affect health and well-being," explains Susan Mann, president of the foundation. "It's an approach usually only seen in urban areas. What we're doing here could become a national model."

Currently, a national job search is underway to find the executive director of the new center, who will also hold the Victor Heiser, MD Endowed Professorship at the Jefferson College of Population Health.

"Ultimately, our goal is to create a measurable, multi-generational impact on the quality of life here," Mann adds. "That will, in turn, have positive effects on the business climate and the vibrancy of our entire community, while lowering the cost of healthcare."

# Giving Back to Improve Lives.

## COMMUNITY IMPACT GRANTS THROUGH UNITED WAY OF THE LAUREL HIGHLANDS ARE MAKING A DIFFERENCE

The 1889 Foundation's first major giving initiative was a \$500,000 challenge grant to the United Way of the Laurel Highlands. The idea behind the gift was to extend the reach and impact of social programs funded by the United Way, and so far, the results have been exciting. We are delighted to partner with the United Way, which has a very thorough community needs assessment and funding program in place — that way, the impact of 1889 funds is maximized.

Here's how this grant has helped, by the numbers:

### Parents as Teachers

Home visitation enrollment increased by 156 families

### Nurse Family Partnership

25 additional families served

### Drug Abuse Prevention for Youth

Enrollment in evidence-based programs increased from 3,800 to 5,000, and programs are expanding into elementary school

### Free Medical Clinic

More individuals served, and program is expanding into Somerset County

### Mindful Art Initiative

More programming offered through Bottleworks initiative

### Dental Clinic

Indigent care increased from 2,738 to 3,500 people

### After School/Preschool Programs

At-risk children served increased from 587 to 683

### Homeless Shelters

Individuals helped to avoid homelessness will increase from 347 to 503

### Girl Scouts

Troop will be formed in an underserved area

### Boy Scouts

Will increase membership and expand services to two additional public housing units

### Children Vision Screening

Will provide vision screening to 100+ children from 0-6



# Creating Community Wellness through the Arts.

1889 FOUNDATION AND PA RURAL ARTS ALLIANCE PARTNER ON CREATIVE HEALTH IMPACT GRANT AWARDS



1889 Foundation cultivates opportunity for improvement in the Arts. The next awards cycle will begin in spring 2017. Watch our website for details!

The arts can play a crucial role in health and well-being. So together with the Pennsylvania Rural Arts Alliance (PRAA), the 1889 Foundation has established the Creative Health Impact Grant Awards, which support arts programs related to health and wellness in Cambria and Somerset County.

The gift establishing the awards comes from legacy funds from the Conemaugh Health Foundation that were donor-designated to support arts programming. The 1889 Foundation's initial commitment to the PRAA for the awards is \$25,000 annually for three years, with the possibility of renewal at that time.

The first six award recipients were announced this summer. Each of the programs will receive an award of \$1,000-5,000. They are:

#### **Bottleworks Ethnic Arts Center:**

**Mindful Arts Initiative** — This program will engage students of low social-economic backgrounds by implementing the Mindful Schools curriculum, which promotes a calming, creative and supportive environment for management of toxic stress.

#### **Community Arts Center of Cambria County:**

**The Language of Art** — Free art classes and workshops for adults and children who are deaf or hard-of-hearing will be facilitated by a sign language interpreter and an art therapist, followed by a public exhibition at the conclusion of the classes and workshops.

#### **Mountain Playhouse:**

**Seniors on the Go: An Interactive Day of Artistic Discovery** — This program provides seniors with free, accessible transportation to see a play and participate in arts activities.

#### **Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art:**

**Arts for the Ages** — Artist-teachers will implement five-day residencies at senior centers, training staff on how to effectively implement and evaluate arts programs.

#### **Johnstown Concert Ballet:**

**Dancing for a Difference** — Partnering with several area dance studios and a program called Kairos Alive, dance workshops will be presented for hospital and hospice staff members, as well as assisted and independent living residents.

#### **Mount Aloysius College:**

**Opening Minds Through Art** — As part of its Expressive Arts for Healing Program, trained volunteers from Mount Aloysius will work with people suffering from dementia on creative arts programs in small group sessions, followed by a public exhibition of the patients' work.
